

Who is eligible for SHARE?

Eligibility for the SHARE Program is subject to change as research progresses. Eligibility is determined by the project team. Currently, our program criteria include:

- 🎗 adolescents between the ages of 11-18 years*
- 🎗 young adults between the ages of 19-21 years
- 🎗 completed all treatment for childhood cancer 1 or more years ago
- 🎗 completion of pre-enrollment screening

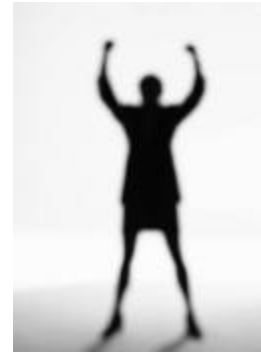
You may have heard

that survivors of childhood cancer have special health needs. Here is your chance to find out more.

The **SHARE** (Survivor Health and Resilience Education) Program is a health counseling program offered in cooperation with Children's National Medical Center and Georgetown University. We are doing research to see if this program is helpful to people like you. Through the SHARE Program, survivors receive information and counseling about eating healthy, exercising, living well, and other tips to stay healthy. The SHARE Program also offers an opportunity for participants to meet other survivors.

This is a free program

that is provided at no cost. In fact, because the SHARE Program is part of a research project, volunteers may receive up to \$55 worth of gift certificates to media stores for completing all project requirements. We will also be giving away other prizes and small gifts.



What does the SHARE Program involve?

Each person will be invited to attend a 3-hour group workshop and will receive:

- ⌘ nutrition feedback
- ⌘ nutrition education and counseling
- ⌘ communication skills training
- ⌘ guidelines for reducing cancer risks
- ⌘ lifestyle management tips

In addition, each participant will be asked to complete up to 3 interviews. Each interview lasts approximately 30 minutes.
